#### 1. TE PŪTAKE PURPOSE

This report is intended to provide an update on housing development data for the district that is produced quarterly.

Data shows a new high in dwellings delivered for the previous 12 months and a solid pipeline of building consents.

Previously we have included this information in progress reports. However, in the absence of these reports we still propose to provide you with quarterly updates.

#### 3. TE MATAPAKI ME NGĀ KŌWHIRINGA DISCUSSION AND OPTIONS

#### National context

National data to May 2024, seasonally adjusted number of new dwellings consented, fell 1.7 percent. The continues a drop of 2.1 percent in April 2024.

In the year ended May 2024, the actual number of new dwellings consented was 34,851, down 23 percent from the year ended May 2023 (table 5). Data for the period May-October, directly comparable the Rotorua pipeline is not available.



New construction data from Statistics NZ released in April shows that it takes around 569 days on average for a home to be built after it receives a building consent.

ANZ bank, in their October 2024 NZ Merchant and Card spending update, identify a significant reduction in household spending on home renovations /improvements. Spending in this category was down 6.7% y/y with a reduction in construction and renovation activity impacting this category nationally.



However, with the gradual decrease in mortgage interest they have identified increased spending with architects and surveyors. This may signal a recovery from the significant drops in consent numbers nationally.



#### Rotorua data to October 2024


Current data indicates a new 12 month high on new dwelling construction for the district. This represents the third year of consecutive record builds. Gross builds being 507 for the 12 months ending 31 October (table 1).






#### The data indicates stronger build numbers in the Eastern and Western areas of the city (graph 5).






The consenting pipeline remains strong for the district and is an important predictor of future dwelling builds. Having reached a peak of approximately 900 dwellings in the pipeline, the number has dropped to approximately 850. Most of these homes are in the Eastern and Western areas of the city (graph 6).



It is evident from the pipeline data that most development continues to be focused in the Eastern and Western areas of the city (graph 7). This information is important for infrastructure planning and improvement prioritisation. It is also a factor considered in seeking adjustments to the original projects timetable of Infrastructure Acceleration Fund (IAF).



#### 4 TE WHAKAKAPINGA CONCLUSION

Data shows a new high in dwellings delivered for the previous 12 months and a solid pipeline of building consents. This contrasts significantly from the national picture for building consents and dwelling builds. Rotorua's current building numbers supported by the currently strong build programme of Kainga Ora and Iwi housing developments
