

Location of proposed new structures and buildings in WWTP upgrade



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
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



- · Does not meet current Dam Safety Guidelines
- Determined to be "Dangerous Dam" and may fail in 10 to 20 year return period event
- To be rebuilt and strengthened under emergency provisions of RMA
- up to current standards and future demand



• Part funded under Water Reform Program bringing infrastructure





Per capita waste generation in Rotorua has increased gradually to >200 kg/year




Climate change mitigation Waste accounts for >6% of Rotorua's emissions - arising primarily from landfilling.




Attachment 4: Plan of Part Pongakawa Valley Road, Rotoehu
