- Maximum of 41 occupants in 14 motel units. This number excludes on-site staff.
- The on-site support service provider is 'Emerge Aotearoa'. They provide:
 - Registered and trained social and support workers available on-site Monday through Friday 8.00am to 5.00pm
 - o 24/7 on-call social and support worker (via phone)
 - 24/7 on-site security.
- Management and occupants are required to follow the requirements laid out in the Site Management Plan. A copy of the Site Management Plan is included in the application.
- 299 Fenton Street is located in the Commercial 4 City Entrance Way Accommodation Zone under the Rotorua District Plan.
