Designed by Te Puia NZMACI, the sculpture is seen as a another-unique way to tell the stories of the region, including the origins of the geothermal features and the story of Te Arawa tohunga (high priest) Ngātoro-i-rangi, who was responsible for the safe passage of his people to Aotearoa. The final stages in the construction of the Hemo Gorge Sculpture are underway with Kilwell in the process of joining the 12 metre long individual pieces together like a giant kitset, ready for installation.

In December 2017 Rotorua's Kilwell Fibretube stepped up to take over the project when the original fabricators were unable to create the shape of the design using stainless steel. A world first in terms of 3D printing, the project has faced a number of manufacturing challenges that has required some real innovation to come up with solutions.

Kilwell CEO Craig Wilson says his firm was keen to be involved as a way to showcase the work they do at the long-time Rotorua business. They also liked the idea of creating a major piece of art that will welcome visitors to the city from the south.

"It's been a ground breaking project with Rotorua Lakes Council, Te Puia | New Zealand Māori Arts and Crafts Institute and the NZ Transport Agency where we have had to blend engineering, manufacturing and art together."

Despite the significant challenges the project has presented, Mr Wilson says he and his staff are very proud of what they have produced and they hope the community will be too.

"For the community and especially also our staff that live within it, it's about showing what Rotorua is capable of.

"A lot of people come to visit us for a weekend and they enjoy our amazing forest and they see all the lovely tourist attractions to do and they go mountain biking, but there's a lot more to here. ...There's some really good manufacturers here in Rotorua and we make some really cool stuff and it sells and it goes really well on the world stage.

"It's nice now to be able to put that back into a local environment and so this sculpture is something that we and hopefully the whole community can be proud of and showcase to everybody that comes to visit here. It's not only a great place to come and play, it's a great place to work as well."

Mr Wilson says as a world first in 3D printing the project has included a stringent testing regime that was put in place by Gurit Composite Engineering.. The sculpture and its base plate have been built to withstand winds of more than 175kmh – that's a grade 5 hurricane.

Challenges the Kilwell team faced were totally new to the world of 3D printing, including fabricating a structure that didn't have the usual linear design that most of Kilwell's projects follow. That meant they had to come up with new solutions. There was no manual to turn to.

Now that the structure is in its final stages of construction the team are putting plans in motion for its transport and installation on site at Hemo Gorge.

The sculpture will have a final height of 12 metres and a total weight of 3,300kg so the team are looking at the most efficient way to transport and install it. All going well it should be in place before the end of June.

At a recent Council meeting Kilwell were able to give an update to elected members about progress including higher than expected final costs for the fabricating and installation of the sculpture of \$743,029. Council confirmed that it would continue the construction of the sculpture and increase its final contribution from \$270,000 to \$388,000 with project partners and Red Stag Timber, Civic Arts Trust, Rotorua Trust, Infinity Foundation and Lion Foundation.

Designed by Te Puia | NZMACI, the sculpture is seen as a unique way to tell the stories of the region, including the origins of the geothermal features and the story of Te Arawa tohunga (high priest) Ngātoro-i-rangi, who was responsible for the safe passage of his people to Aotearoa. It provides another opportunity for NZMACI to fulfil its Government mandate, to perpetuate, preserve and promote Māori arts and crafts — but in a contemporary way, with the design derived from whakairo rākau (wood carving).

Background

Timeline

- November 2015: Council calls for expressions of interest from artists
- February 2016 13 expressions of interest are received
- Late Feb 2016 A shortlist of 5 is selected by an external Public Art Selection Panel and those artists are invited to develop their concepts for the sculpture
- Mid-April 2016 Te Puia | New Zealand M\u00e4ori Arts and Crafts Institute selected for its concept
- May 2016 Engineers brought in to provide advice and plan for the fabrication of the 10m tall sculpture
- Late 2016 Tender process for a preferred contractor to construct the sculpture started

- Late August 2017 Council considers new options to speed up construction of sculpture

What is the Hemo Gorge roundabout project?

The SH5/SH30 Hemo Road intersection project involved the construction of a new roundabout to replace the SH5/SH30 intersection in Rotorua to increase safety for drivers, cyclists and pedestrians. The project was completed in 2018.

Key objectives of the project were to:

- increase safety at this high-risk intersection (fourth highest on the national list of high-risk intersections for safety (2013).
- enhance connectivity and integrate with the surrounding area and local roads
- provide cycle and pedestrian access across the state highway and integrate it with the national cycleway

- create a gateway to Rotorua in partnership with Council and the local tourism businesses
- provide enhanced stormwater treatment.

What are the benefits of a sculpture at Hemo Road?

Visual aspects along transport corridors are a type of traffic calming measure. Motorists that do not have a clear line of sight through a roundabout will slow down and take their time travelling through. Artwork, trees and signage are all types of traffic calming measures that help slow motorists.

The NZ Transport Agency's Urban Design Guidelines say public art can be successfully integrated in the design of highway corridors to deliver a number of benefits including:

- creating a sense of arrival
- bolstering a community's identity and sense of pride
- helping integrate infrastructure elements into the wider environment
- integrating cultural heritage and values at the city's gateway

This sculpture will also play a key role in Council's aim to revitalise the city's gateways.

For Te Puia | New Zealand Māori Arts and Crafts Institute, the sculpture provides another opportunity to perpetuate, preserve and promote Māori Art and Craft, as outlined in its Government mandate.

What does the sculpture represent?

The sculpture was inspired by the story of Te Arawa chief Ngātoroirangi, who was responsible for the safe passage of people to New Zealand. Designed by the New Zealand Maori Arts and Crafts Institute (NZMACI) at Te Puia, the sculpture illustrates the origins of geothermal. While exploring south of Rotorua Ngātoroirangi almost perished from the cold atop Tongariro and called for his sisters Kuiwai and Haungaroa to send heat and warmth to save him. They travelled beneath sea and land in the form of fire, creating a geothermal corridor and valleys such as Whakarewarewa as they travelled and surfaced at various locations in search of him. NZMACI has a Government mandate to perpetuate, preserve and promote Māori arts and crafts, and the sculpture is another way it can fulfill this mandate.

Kia ora koutou,

Corrie Taylor from NZTA has had a request come through from Minister Shane Jones' office that he would like to attend 'the event' being planned for the Hemo sculpture. Minister Jones is associate transport minister.

I've spoken to Chris Farnsworth in our office, who's the project manager involved from our end, and he has some pretty big concerns about the below timing. It sounds like the process of getting this sculpture into place is going to be massive and will need an intensive traffic management plan. Just a quick update on this. I met with some of the project group last week. The meeting was more about how we will promote the story of the sculpture once it's finished etc.

We spoke briefly about the TMP and Kilwell have confirmed they will be working directly with Chris or whoever is the lead from NZTA on the plan. We have someone from Council who will sit in on meetings so they are aware of how the plan will roll.

In terms of installation and an event. Kilwell confirmed it's still on track to be finished end of Spring. But nailing down a date for installation is the hard part. They have to line up the TMP, the helicopter and good weather to be able to move the sculpture. Obviously it's going to be hard to pinpoint a date for that in advance.

We had a short discussion about what the event would look like – we agreed it would need to happen after installation because there is on-site work that needs to happen once the sculpture is flown in. That could take anywhere up to a week so the event may happen the following week to coincide with the storyboard plaques going in.

I've spoken to Chris Farnsworth in our office, who's the project manager involved from our end, and he has some pretty big concerns about the below timing. It sounds like the process of getting this sculpture into place is going to be massive and will need an intensive traffic management plan. It might be worth checking in on this as understand nothing's been started yet and it wont be something that can be pulled together quickly. I understand this can be started without having confirmed timing.

On a similar note, has any more progress occurred on a plan for the opening event? What type of event, where it will be held, who is attending, etc. Conscious there is a lot to consider, e.g. number of people who can fit in the underpass site, avoiding guests crossing the highway, timing considering we won't know for sure which day the sculpture can be helicoptered in, etc.

As advised in October the inner helix, which you can see from the road in Kilwell's parking area, is now up. Construction of the outer helix is progressing. The team at Kilwell are working through an issue with the alignment of a section of the outer helix but are working to complete it as close to the end of spring as they can.

Moving the sculpture to Hemo roundabout requires aligning the timing for road closure, calm weather and the availability of the transport helicopter. Pinpointing a date for installation will depend on those three factors coming together. Just to reiterate that these aspects are out of Council's control. The traffic management aspect is managed by NZTA as owner of the State Highway. They will determine the safest, least disruptive date for the installation of the sculpture. The private transport helicopter also needs to be available and obviously, the weather is up to Mother Nature.

Here is the update re Hemo sculpture for your information – please note this is just information rather than quotes.

As advised in October the inner helix, which you can see from the road in Kilwell's parking area, is now up. Construction of the outer helix is progressing. The team at Kilwell are working through an issue with the alignment of a section of the outer helix but are working to complete it as close to the end of spring as they can.

Moving the sculpture to Hemo roundabout requires aligning the timing for road closure, calm weather and the availability of the transport helicopter. Pinpointing a date for installation will depend on those three factors coming together. Just to reiterate that these aspects are out of Council's control. The traffic management aspect is managed by NZTA as owner of the State Highway. They will determine the safest, least disruptive date for the installation of the sculpture. The private transport helicopter also needs to be available and obviously, the weather is up to Mother Nature.

There will be no change to Council's contribution towards the sculpture from the amount reported back in March of \$388,000.



Our staff are working with Kilwell and the project partners to ensure everything goes as smoothly as possible. [Sam see previous information provided about those factors that need to align for installation]

From Kilwell Chief Executive, Craig Wilson -

While we didn't get the sculpture finished and erected by the end of spring like we wanted, we are down to the final piece which the team are really excited about.

Blending art, technology and physical manufacturing, and the fact that this is the first time it has been done anywhere in the world, means that we could not have foreseen the challenges we have come up against in this project. I am proud that our team, along with assistance from Gurit engineers, have been able to overcome each challenge in an innovative way. There has been no manual or even a similar project to compare it to – just our team doing what we do best and a bit of Kiwi innovation.

The team is now focussed on getting the last piece finished and then it will be making sure everything is in order for the delivery to Hemo roundabout.

Working on a world first, using ground breaking technology means we aren't always going to get it right the first time. We are relying on computer-generated files that guide the 3D print machines. The printed products then require physical manufacturing to hand laminate each section. The alignment of the latest section was incorrect either in the files or in the printing process. This means the team needed to manually realign the section and relaminate extending the finish date of the project.

Sculpture milestone for Kilwell Rotorua

The finish line is in sight for Kilwell Rotorua's team with the second helix of the Hemo sculpture now standing at its full height.

A crane helped lift the four quarters of the sculpture's outer helix into place this week and the team at Kilwell are gearing up to attach the connection pieces between each quarter.

This stage marks the beginning of the end of what has been a challenging project but Kilwell Chief Executive Craig Wilson says that the hard part isn't over quite yet.

"This is a definite milestone for our team. They have all had a hand in creating this structure so to see it standing now is something we are all proud of.

"Creating a structure of this size out of these materials has never been done before. There's been no manual or instructions to follow, just our team engineering solutions like Kilwell has done in Rotorua for 60 years.

Mr Wilson says that there is still more work to do to make sure the sculpture is ready to fly to its home at the Hemo gorge roundabout.

"Then it will be up to Mother Nature to make sure we have a date for installation. There are a number of factors that need to line up to make sure we can get the sculpture to its home."

These factors include the weather, confirming the Traffic Management Plan and the availability of the helicopter and its pilot, who is currently in Australia assisting with the effort to extinguish the bushfires.

For now, the team at Kilwell will continue with the work to finish the sculpture and ready it for installation.

More about the Hemo sculpture:

Design:

The sculpture was inspired by the story of Te Arawa chief Ngātoroirangi, who was responsible for the safe passage of people to New Zealand. Designed by the New Zealand Māori Arts and Crafts Institute (NZMACI) at Te Puia, the sculpture illustrates the origins of geothermal.

While exploring south of Rotorua Ngātoroirangi almost perished from the cold atop Tongariro and called for his sisters Kuiwai and Haungaroa to send heat and warmth to save him. They travelled beneath sea and land in the form of fire, creating a geothermal corridor and valleys such as Whakarewarewa as they travelled and surfaced at various locations in search of him. NZMACI has a Government mandate to perpetuate, preserve and promote Māori arts and crafts, and the sculpture is another way it can fulfill this mandate.

Background:

Creating the sculpture for the roundabout is a joint project between NZ Transport Agency and Rotorua Lakes Council with funding contributions from Red Stag, the Rotorua Community Arts Trust, Lion Foundation, Infinity Foundation and Rotorua Trust.

The NZ Transport Agency's Urban Design Guidelines say public art can be successfully integrated in the design of highway corridors to deliver a number of benefits including:

- · creating a sense of arrival
- bolstering a community's identity and sense of pride
- · helping integrate infrastructure elements into the wider environment
- integrating cultural heritage and values at the city's gateway

This sculpture will also play a key role in Council's aim to revitalise the city's gateways.

For Te Puia | New Zealand Māori Arts and Crafts Institute, the sculpture provides another opportunity to perpetuate, preserve and promote Māori Art and Craft, as outlined in its Government mandate

Calls for expressions from artists were made in November 2015 with Te Puia | New Zealand Māori Arts and Crafts Institute's concept selected in April 2016.

After the initial contractor wasn't able to construct the sculpture local firm Kilwell Fibretube approached Council to take on the project.

Challenges:

Being the first structure in the world of this size, and of these materials, the team at Kilwell have come up against a number of challenges that no one could have predicted. This project has had to blend art, technology and engineering to create a strong, robust structure that reflects the beauty of a traditional Maori carving.

I've added the response from the other day so you can see exactly what went to the media. Nothing has been finalised. I need to do some work here to get all the parties together and find out what the latest is. I think COVID has thrown in a bit of curve ball so there are some conversations that I need to get in on. I will do that mahi and get some updated info to you when I can.

Response 3 June 2020

Please see answers below to your questions. You can attribute the answers to Jocelyn Mikaere (Manahautū Mahi J Group Manager, Operations):

Could you please let me know whether an installation date has been set? From previous stories, I am aware of what needs to fall in place in order to install the sculpture, so if a date has not been set, how much notice does the council expect it will be able to give once a date has been set?

- A date for installation has not been set. Given its complex nature and the variables that need to align, Council cannot give an indication of how much notice can be given prior to installation.

Has the outer helix of the sculpture been completed?

- Yes. Both helix's have now been completed with final tubes laminated in place and just some final sanding work being done. Kilwell is now just awaiting fine weather for these tubes and joints to be painted.

Has the delay caused by the lockdown increased the cost of the project? If so, by how much and what is the current total cost (the last story we did had it at \$743,029)

- There have been no further decisions about costs over and above the \$388,000 contribution that Council committed to in March 2019. Elected members would need to consider and make final decisions about any variation to Council's contribution.

In a November story it said: The council confirmed the budget for making and installing the sculpture was unchanged and there would be no change to the \$388,000 contribution the council had made.

If this is the case, who is picking up the additional costs?

- See previous answer

How much will it cost to have a helicopter install the sculpture and was this cost built into the original budget or will it add to the end cost?

- As an installation date has not been set there is no final cost however, there was allowance within original budget for transportation.

I've had a catch up with Chris on this. Think we may have a couple of wires crossed. Few points below but let me know if you want to set up a skype to chat?

- Chris doesn't own or manage the TMP, this sits with RLC (WSP supporting?) and I believe gets final sign off from Josh Coombes at Higgins. So Chris isn't working on a plan for traffic management but he's here to provide guidance as required.

The sculpture cannot be laid down, it has to be kept upright. If they cannot be put in place for some reason, they will need to be put down about 30 – 40 metres (or closer if possible) to the centre line of the road – see my sketch attached. To secure the two helixes, concrete anchoring block will need to be placed according to the sketch. When you are coordinating the delivery and placement of the blocks with NZTA, please make sure they keep the distance and orientation as per drawing. If they have difficulties with the location, please let me know and we can re-assess it on site.

Communications Plan Hemo sculpture installation – September 2020

Background

In 2015, prior to the construction of Hemo Gorge roundabout, Waka Kotahi-NZ Transport Agency and Rotorua Lakes Council agreed to jointly commission a piece of art to integrate into the landscape once construction was complete. Integrating public art into major State Highway upgrades is part of Waka Kotahi's Urban Design Guidelines as a way to create gateways, sense of place, tell culturally significant and local stories. Council sought expressions of interest for the design in late 2015. From 13 EOIs submitted to an external panel for consideration, five artists were invited to present developed concepts. The panel unanimously selected Te Puia/NZMACI as the successful concept.

Initially the Council awarded the construction of the sculpture to a steel manufacturer in Hamilton, with a subcontractor in Canada responsible for rolling and curving the steel into the shape we see today. The initial installation date (prior to Kilwell's involvement) was June/July 2017. Following delays and the eventual realisation that creating the design from steel was unachievable, RLC and NZTA looked to other options for fabrication.

At the end of 2017, Kilwell Fibretube approached Council with a proposal to manufacture the sculpture using 3D printing technology and carbon fibre composite materials. It was a win-win situation for all parties to achieve a locally designed and manufactured sculpture to place at the southern gateway of Rotorua.

The new construction method required digitisation of the design and translation of section into 3D printing files. Kilwell began 3D printing at the end of March 2018 with an expected installation date of August/September that year. A number of challenges meant the time frame for construction was extended significantly – 3D printing issues, considerable changes to certification requirements, reconciling conflicts between design and realistic engineering, testing, COVID and transportation. For every challenge, Kilwell had to innovate a solution. Construction of the sculpture was finished at the beginning of 2020, with painting finalised at the end of winter. Some minor work will need to be finished on-site following installation.

The operation to get the sculpture from Kilwell to Hemo gorge is complex due to the size, shape and weight of the sculpture. The two options for transportation were via house-moving truck or helicopter. Research into both methods determined that even though the risk is slightly higher, a helicopter would be faster and cheaper. Rotorua Lakes Council and Kilwell are working with experienced helicopter operators and ground crew to identify and mitigate hazards and execute the installation safely and with as little risk to person, place and property as possible.

- Transport and installation will be by helicopter. It will travel via a pre-approved flight path from Kilwell to Hemo gorge. We ask that people avoid any unnecessary trips within this flight path between the hours of 6am – 10am.
- Stop/go traffic will be in place on the day of installation it is expected that traffic could be held in place for a period of time while the installation is underway.
- Traffic management will also be in place at XXXXXXX to restrict traffic movements during transportation over public roads.

A secondary requirement for communications is to share the story of Hemo sculpture to raise awareness about its significance as more than a piece of art and inspire community pride. Careful consideration of how, when and where PR is shared to support the installation will determine the success of helping the public to understand the magnitude and importance of this sculpture. In order to achieve this, RLC communications will coordinate with project partners to determine appropriate partner, channel and timing for sharing key information.

Objective

This installation plan is outlines the process of lifting the Hemo Gorge Roundabout Sculpture from the production facility at Kilwell Fibretube, located at 490 Te Ngae Road to the middle of the roundabout on SH30 outside Te Puia for installation.

The following must be read and understood by all team members including the attached Project Register.

Project Overview, Hemo Gorge Sculpture

The sculptures is comprised of two pieces – the inner and outer helixes. Installation methodology has two key stages:

- 1. Helicopter the sculptures (outer and inner helixes) to Te Puia Car Park
- 2. Crane sculptures from car park into Hemo Roundabout.

Each helix will be flown to the Te Puia Car Park, and craned into place, separately.

Proposed installation date/s

Sunday 6th, Saturday 12th, and Sunday 13th September.

It is expected the installation will take between 2 and 6 hours. Approximate timeframe for installation is 6:30am – 12pm.

If we cannot get Traffic Management Approval for the Hemo Roundabout for Sunday 6th, if weather allows, we will consider helicoptering the sculpture from Kilwell to the Te Puia Car Park site and then do the crane install at a later date.

NOTE: Depending on Traffic Management Approval, the two stages could be undertaken separately between Sunday 6th and Saturday 19th September.

We need it calm or a slight breeze from the west so as to be able to fly in from the east. Preferred time for the lift is early morning to take advantage of low wind and traffic volumes. Wind speed over 20 knots or any wind from the East will mean a No GO. We will make a decision 3 – 4 days before if it looks possible to make the installation, and then a final confirmation the night before. This decision will be made by the pilot in conjunction with the Install Lead.

Programme

- Have a landing platform set up at Te Puia car park with anchor blocks to secure the helixes to
- Have eastern (forest) side of roundabout closed off, with stop/go running traffic through the western side of roundabout
- Have crane parked on road on eastern side of roundabout
- Fly outer helix onto car park landing platform and secure to anchor blocks
- As helicopter flies back to Kilwell, crane picks up outer helix and moves to inside of roundabout (still attached to crane)

- Helicopter lands inner helix at carpark and it's secured to anchor blocks
- Install outer helix and then inner helix by crane.

Installation Teams

The following project plan shows the approximate estimated timings and responsibilities of each team in the installation. Teams are as follows:

- ML Mark Law (Pilot) & Chopper.
 Role is to lift helixes and place into Te Puia Car Park.
- K1 Kilwell Team No.1 onsite at Kilwell, 490 Te Ngae Road.Role is to attach lifting harness and flight sail to helixes and then longline to lifting harness.
- KH1 Kahu Helicopters ground Crew team at Kilwell Role is to attach lifting harness and flight sail to helixes and then longline to lifting harness.
- KH2 Kahu Helicopters ground Crew team in Te Puia carpark.
 Role is to guide pilot from landing site, receive loads, and secure helixes before detaching from longline.
- K2 Kilwell team No.2 in Te Puia carpark.

 Role is to manage installation of helixes by crane and bolting of baseplate to sculpture plinth once installed in roundabout.
- IMP Impell specialist ground team to assist with installation at roundabout
- PC Pollock Cranes (operator and Dogman)
 Role is to crane helixes from Te Puia Car Park and place on sculpture plinth in roundabout.
 Includes connecting crane line to helix lifting harnesses.
- WB Will Bamford RLC lead. Role is to be in charge of the project overview, including having total authority to make decisions on the day of the lift. Contractually, this is Kilwell's responsibility. - Flight route is 95% above lake, farmland, and forest. Roads will be closed to allow helicopter with underslung load and longline to cross safely
- We do not require road closure at Roundabout for helicopter to drop off helixes in Te Puia Car Park.
- Specific detail on TMP will be within the approved traffic management plan.
- There are three main components to the Traffic management:

Securing helicopter path:

Stop and go road closures will be set up at the following locations to temporarly close the road (approximately 30seconds) as the helicopter crosses with underslung load and/or longline. This will occur 4 times at each location:

- Vaughans Road Crossing (between 258B and 264 Vaughan Rd)
- Te Ngae Road crossing (cross over Volcanic Air straight onto the paddock which is north of Wahanga-A-Rangi Cres (borders industrial park))
- Tarawera Road Crossing (west of Okareka Loop/Tarawera Rds Intersection)

Hemo Roundabout

The eastern (forest) side of Hemo Roundabout will be closed off, with stop/go running traffic through the western side of roundabout.

3 x VMS boards to be installed 3 days prior to event

Helicopter Summary

Once clearance is received from Rotorua Airport ML will confirm with the Hemo Roundabout site teams (KH2, TM, IMP and K2) and begin the flight project plan as detailed below.

Outer Helix

- 1. Rotorua Airport (Location 4) ML connects longline to helicopter, radios traffic management to stop traffic and flies to Kilwells (location 1) 5mins
- 2. Location 1 K1/KH1 to connect Outer Helix to ML 5mins
- Flight path ML radios traffic management to stop traffic and flies flight path. Crosses Vaughan's
 Rd at Location 2, then up the lake to Airport crossing Te Ngae Rd at Location 5. Flies across
 farmland to cross Tarawera Rd at Location 6 and then across the Whakarewarewa Forest to Te
 Puia Car Park (Location 8) 15mins
- 4. Puts helix down at Te Puia Car Park and waits for it to be secured before disconnecting hook 5mins
- 5. Flies flight path back to Kilwells, informing traffic management as required. Filling up at airport if need 5mins

Inner Helix

- 6. Location 1 K1/KH1 to connect Inner Helix to ML 5mins
- Flight path ML radios traffic management to stop traffic and flies flight path. Crosses Vaughan's
 Rd at Location 2, then up the lake to Airport crossing Te Ngae Rd at Location 5. Flies across
 farmland to cross Tarawera Rd at Location 6 and then across the Whakarewarewa Forest to Te
 Puia Car Park (Location 8) 15mins
- 8. Puts helix down at Te Puia Car Park and waits for it to be secured before disconnecting hook 5mins
- 9. Flies flight path back to airport, informing traffic management as required. Disconnects longline and heads back to Whakatane 5mins



Crane Summary

- 1. Once ML takes off, connect helix to hook and lift into roundabout and commence installation
- 2. If possible, install and secure outer helix to sculpture plinth before inner helix arrives at car park. If inner helix arrives before outer helix install is complete, outer helix to be raised and secured by crane within roundabout while inner helix is secured.
- 3. Once outer helix is installed, commence installation if inner helix.
- 4. It is expected Crane installation will take between 1 and 5 hours.

Drop zone and Traffic Management locations:




The eastern (forest) side of Hemo Roundabout will be closed off, with stop/go running traffic through the western side of roundabout.

As required, all pedestrian traffic is to be halted and held at TM4.


There will be an area set aside (min 25m by 25m) at Te Puia car park to drop the helixes and tie them down. The helixes will be secured by guidelines to deadman anchors (either containers or concrete blocks). This area can also be used for the Helicopter to land if experiencing issues.

The crane will be located on Hemo Road. The distance between the Crane and both the work area in Te Puia Car Park and the sculpture plinth is approximately 25m. The crane has a working reach of 30m.

Installation Trouble Shooting

- The outer helix will have guidelines on it to guide it to place.
- There is plywood on inside of first helix to guide second one (as it sits inside the outer helix). This one won't have guidelines.
- The bolts the baseplates are dropping on are M16 and the holes in the platform are 25mm. The outer platform is sitting on 48 M16 bolts. The inner helix 24
- We will have 2 4 130mm 150mm bolt sleeves per helix to assist with lining baseplate and bolts up
- The bolts and the baseplate have been run over with a template 3+ times
- The crane allows us to hold the baseplates over the bolts and get alignment before lowering the helixes into place.
- If the bolts are out of alignment or get damaged, PC will lift up and we will have sledge hammers
 to straighten the bolt back up. If damaged, Laszlo is comfortable rethreading the bolts once helix
 is in place (or grouting bolt in place)
- We will have angle grinders for worse case scenario of having to get rid of a bolt
- The area in the Te Puia car park will be set up to store the sculptures if we cannot get them installed on the plinth on the day.

Communications Plan Hemo sculpture installation – September 2020

Background

In 2015, prior to the construction of Hemo Gorge roundabout, Waka Kotahi-NZ Transport Agency and Rotorua Lakes Council agreed to jointly commission a piece of art to integrate into the landscape once construction was complete. Integrating public art into major State Highway upgrades is part of Waka Kotahi's Urban Design Guidelines as a way to create gateways, sense of place, tell culturally significant and local stories. Council sought expressions of interest for the design in late 2015. From 13 EOIs submitted to an external panel for consideration, five artists were invited to present developed concepts. The panel unanimously selected Te Puia/NZMACI as the successful concept.

Initially the Council awarded the construction of the sculpture to a steel manufacturer in Hamilton, with a subcontractor in Canada responsible for rolling and curving the steel into the shape we see today. The initial installation date (prior to Kilwell's involvement) was June/July 2017. Following delays and the eventual realisation that creating the design from steel was unachievable, RLC and NZTA looked to other options for fabrication.

At the end of 2017, Kilwell Fibretube approached Council with a proposal to manufacture the sculpture using 3D printing technology and carbon fibre composite materials. It was a win-win situation for all parties to achieve a locally designed and manufactured sculpture to place at the southern gateway of Rotorua.

The new construction method required digitisation of the design and translation of section into 3D printing files. Kilwell began 3D printing at the end of March 2018 with an expected installation date of August/September that year. A number of challenges meant the time frame for construction was extended significantly – 3D printing issues, considerable changes to certification requirements, reconciling conflicts between design and realistic engineering, testing, COVID and transportation. For every challenge, Kilwell had to innovate a solution. Construction of the sculpture was finished at the beginning of 2020, with painting finalised at the end of winter. Some minor work will need to be finished on-site following installation.

The operation to get the sculpture from Kilwell to Hemo gorge is complex due to the size, shape and weight of the sculpture. The two options for transportation were via house-moving truck or helicopter. Research into both methods determined that even though the risk is slightly higher, a helicopter would be faster and cheaper. Rotorua Lakes Council and Kilwell are working with experienced helicopter operators and ground crew to identify and mitigate hazards and execute the installation safely and with as little risk to person, place and property as possible.

- The pedestrian/bike area of Hemo gorge roundabout will be closed from 6am to at least 10am on the day of installation.
- Transport and installation will be by helicopter. It will travel via a pre-approved flight path from Kilwell to Hemo gorge. We ask that people avoid any unnecessary trips within this flight path between the hours of 6am – 10am.
- Stop/go traffic will be in place on the day of installation it is expected that traffic could be held
 in place for a period of time while the installation is underway.
- Traffic management will also be in place at XXXXXXX to restrict traffic movements during transportation over public roads.

Communications approach

A secondary requirement for communications is to share the story of Hemo sculpture to raise awareness about its significance as more than a piece of art and inspire community pride. Careful consideration of how, when and where PR is shared to support the installation will determine the success of helping the public to understand the magnitude and importance of this sculpture. In order to achieve this, RLC communications will coordinate with project partners to determine appropriate partner, channel and timing for sharing key information.

Major milestone imminent - Te Ahi Tupua installation

The final milestones for Te Ahi Tupua (aka 'Hemo sculpture') are just around the corner with plans being finalised to relocate the artwork to its home at the southern entrance to Rotorua.

Council, alongside partners Waka Kotahi – NZ Transport Agency, Kilwell Fibretube and Te Puia I NZMACI have mapped out the complex operation for installation. The teams are now relying on Mother Nature to provide ideal weather conditions to get the sculpture into place.

Installation is planned for a date within the next two weeks with the earliest day for installation being Sunday 6 September. The operation is weather dependent so while preparation is underway for the earliest opportunity, changes to the forecast could mean moving the installation to another day.

Due to the size and shape of the sculpture, the best form of transportation is via helicopter. The flight path will take the sculpture from Kilwell Fibretube on Te Ngae Road to Hemo Gorge. A crane will then lift the sculpture allowing it be settled in place within the roundabout.

During installation, due to the use of heavy machinery, the southern Te Puia carpark and parts Hemo roundabout will be considered a worksite. Those areas will be accessible by authorised personnel only. Traffic management and security teams will be on site to maintain a safe zone around the work area and to direct traffic through the roundabout.

What you need to know:

- Installation is weather dependent Sunday 6 September is the earliest date for installation.
- Installation will take place between the hours of 6am and 10.30am.
- Stop/go traffic management will be in place at Hemo roundabout to direct traffic during installation. Motorists may experience delays of up to 10 minutes.
- Pedestrian/bike entry to Hemo roundabout will be closed during installation.
- Entry to the southern Te Puia carpark will be closed to pedestrians, bikes and vehicles during installation.
- The flight plan avoids all residential areas however, stop/go traffic management will be in place at three locations where the helicopter will cross over public roads – motorists may experience delays of up to 10 minutes.

The three locations are:

- Vaughan Road (behind Puketawhero Park)
- Te Ngae Road (east of Eastgate Business Park)
- Tarawara Road (near intersection of Okareka Loop Road)
- Early morning mountain bikers should be aware that the flight path does travel over the Whakarewarewa forest.

Kia ora again

Just another piece to add to this public notice – I wanted to provide some background info but as I have been writing it I realise it's quite a long story to put on one page. I also need to get this approved by each partner.

Keen to get your thoughts. Do you think it's just enough? Or too much to go with tomorrows public notice? The design info came from what Te Puia has provided in the past.

Background

In 2015, prior to the construction of Hemo Gorge roundabout, Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency and Rotorua Lakes Council agreed to jointly commission a piece of art to integrate into the landscape once construction was complete. Integrating public art into major State Highway upgrades is part of Waka Kotahi's Urban Design Guidelines as a way to create gateways, sense of place, tell culturally significant and local stories.

Design

Following an artist selection process, the design submitted by Te Puia I NZMACI was unanimously selected by the external panel. Te Ahi Tupua – meaning 'The Eternal Fire' represents the origins of geothermal activity in Rotorua and tells the story of Te Arawa Chief Ngātoro-i-rangi. After the Te Arawa waka landed, Ngātoro-i-rangi began his journey to Te Puku o Te Ika a Māui (the belly of the great fish of Māui) in the Central North Island.

Following many stops, he arrived at Mt Tongariro – a mountain on the Central Plateau south of Taupo. It was here that Ngātoro-i-rangi was caught in a blizzard of snow and ice. Struck by the cold, and in danger of perishing, he called for his sisters in Hawaiiki - Kuiwai and Haungaroa - for help. The pair filled six baskets with glowing embers, offspring of Rūaumoko, the God of volcanic energy. They then sent the demi-god siblings Te Hoata and Te Pupu to deliver the baskets of heat.

The pathway Te Hoata and Te Pupu travelled was different to that of Ngātoro-i-rangi but can be seen in a direct line from White Island to Tongariro – and is shown by the string of geothermal features along the path at the points they surfaced. The Whakarewarewa Valley at Te Puia was one of these places – and you can still see where they surfaced and where Rūaumoko, and his energy, remain active to this day.

Construction

The sculpture was originally designed to be built from steel however, following issues with the original manufacturer Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency and Rotorua Lakes Council looked to other options for construction. In December 2017 local manufacturers Kilwell Fibretube approached Council with a proposal to build the sculpture from 3D printed polymer and carbon fibre — much like the fishing rods they are so famous for. This is a world-first — there is not another sculpture of its size that is constructed in this way.

The 3D printed skeleton is made up of more than 1000 pieces connected together to form the curved cylinders that create the helix affect. Each section was hand-wrapped to form 25 layers of carbon fibre strips which were then cured with epoxy resin.



Public notice plan B Major milestone imminent - Te Ahi Tupua installation

The final milestones for Te Ahi Tupua (aka 'Hemo sculpture') are just around the corner with plans being finalised to relocate the artwork to its home at the southern entrance to Rotorua.

Council, alongside partners Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency, Kilwell Fibretube and Te Puia I NZMACI have mapped out the complex operation for installation. The teams are now relying on Mother Nature to provide ideal weather conditions to get the sculpture into place.

The initial part of the installation operation, which involves use of a helicopter to move the artwork, is planned for the next fortnight. The earliest day for transportation is Saturday 12 September. The helicopter operation is strictly weather dependent so while preparation is underway for the earliest opportunity, changes to the forecast could mean transporting Te Ahi Tupua on another day.

The size and shape of the sculpture means the best method of transportation is via a specialty helicopter. The flight path will take the sculpture in two separate trips from Kilwell Fibretube on Te Ngae Road to Te Puia carpark next to the roundabout.

What you need to know:

- Installation is strictly weather dependent meaning the team won't know exactly when installation will occur until the morning of.
- There is a limited window of availability for the specialty helicopter. Saturday 12 September is the earliest date for installation.
- The helicopter flight plan avoids all residential areas

PRESENTATION:

WILL BAMFORD

- Installation process
 - Helicopter to Te Puia car park; 100T crane in situ to pick up & load into place. The chopper will arrive into either Rotorua or Whakatane on Friday. Need to have two weekends with good weather windows.
 - Map of flight plan shared on screen
 - This will minimize working under the chopper & problems with hearing instructions etc & time pressures with road closures
 - The sculpture is locked down by 48 bolts which may require adjustment to enable sculpture to be put in place
 - Road closures will be in place where required; the crane will complete the outer helix, followed by the inner helix.
 - Likely will take between 1.5hrs and 5hrs to complete.
 - The combined option will mean roads would not need to be closed & the road would be open with two lanes operational with stop & go at all times at 30km with the ability to stop traffic for 1-2 minutes if required for safety.
 - NZTA could allow for any day of the week for installation which opens up more possibilities for installation with TMP approved.
 - VNS signage required for 3 days prior
 - Crane would lift at first light 5:30-6:00am and out by 7:30-8:30an
 - Craig agree the two stage install is a good idea, however if NZTA do not approve the plan Kilwell would prefer not to leave it in the carpark for a week would prefer to install the following weekend.
 - Mandy what road closures will be required?
 - Road crossing closures only won't require road to be closed.
 - The pilot has advised weather on Saturday is good and Sunday it is OK.
 - 10 day window only for use of chopper as it leaves Thursday 17 September for Palmerston North for six weeks, then will go to Australia for the fire season.
 - More discussion to be held over coming days.
 - Greater risk with increased awareness from public versus being low key
 - Makes sense to try and do it all in one day
 - There was a bunch of quiet talking which I was unable to hear anything, with people talking over one another.

PRESENTATION CONT.

- o In a nutshell:
 - Option A
 - Chopper used for full installation & everything complete by 11am chopper flying to site Sunday or during the week
 - Option B
 - Chopper used for to fly helixes to Te Puia, and install with crane, whereby crane installation would happen between 3:00am & 6:00am
 - → Jocelyn To clarify a two-step approach would require security around the structure including temporary fencing / static guard?
 - It is possible that CCTV would have a level of security however this requires further discussion.
 - Plan A is the best option.
 - NZTA as it is a state highway if the sculpture is to be installed on a later date - will it be a distraction / hazard?
- o NZTA a huge undertaking with very large comms & reputational risk some queries:
 - How will RLC / Kilwell manage risk around it; is it time pressured due to the chopper availability? NZTA feel it is unrealistic that it could happen this Sunday due to the significant work required.
 - NZTA will be required to notify Minister Twyford for his report and where is the comfort level of RLC elected members on the installation

with submission to NZTA Tuesday / Wednesday

- ➡ Will the sculpture would be guarded in the car park. Following indications that we required the larger chopper & its availability together with the spring weather implications has added the pressure.
 Everything is good to go for this weekend, plans are in place; paperwork being finalised this afternoon TMNZ have draft plans & drawings to Higgins
- ➡ Vicki comms plan is not yet finalised awaiting decisions from today given the changes & hybrid approval over the weekend for change in method for installation; crisis comms – have worked on all the risks in terms of comms & intention for public notification to be advised of 4 dates for which installation could be over any one of these.

Creating a press release & comms planning for Plans A, B & C.

The elected members have been aware the installation was pending late September via our Operations report in late August. Following this meeting a heads up will be sent to RLC elected members that will be vague, incorporating the flight plan over the forest to Hemo; it will be factual & quite vanilla. This is due to the H&S risks of a lot of people turning up.

Once installed we can plan an event in conjunction with Te Puia.

A karakia will be said at Kilwell; with signage installed after the installation.

- TMP managed by Mandy
 - Creating a holding area at Toi Ohomai which is a safe place given we are still in Level 2 and we don't want numbers of more than 100 turning up. Blanket TMP being signed off, with public notice today; this will require a tweak due to the hybrid option.
 - Copy of installation plant to be sent to Claire

NEXT STEPS:

- With the push to go ahead on Sunday
 - Possibly this will become a two stage process with the balance of installation next weekend 12-13
 September.
 - To submit traffic plan for these two dates
 - o Need to ensure the comms package addresses both options
 - Comms plan is 80% done, with just the stakeholder assessment to be completed
 - Following installation the press release should have the four partners saying the same messaging
 - o Kingi Biddle has confirmed karakia before it leaves to make sure of safe journey, and someone to complete karakia when on site when the work is finished, together with karakia at the event.
 - This information needs to be shared with Claire
 - O Need clear contact of one person from each organisation someone who can answer / make a decision

We are not installing this weekend. Pending final TMP/NZTA approval (due Monday), we will be installing weekend 12th/13th Sept.

The two options are:



Public notice plan B

Major milestone imminent - Te Ahi Tupua installation

The final milestones for Te Ahi Tupua (aka 'Hemo sculpture') are just around the corner with plans being finalised to relocate the artwork to its home at the southern entrance to Rotorua.

Council, alongside partners Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency, Kilwell Fibretube and Te Puia I NZMACI have mapped out the complex operation for installation. The teams are now relying on Mother Nature to provide ideal weather conditions to get the sculpture into place.

The initial part of the installation operation, which involves use of a helicopter to move the artwork, is planned for the next fortnight. The earliest day for transportation is Saturday 12 September. The helicopter operation is strictly weather dependent so while preparation is underway for the earliest opportunity, changes to the forecast could mean transporting Te Ahi Tupua on another day.

The size and shape of the sculpture means the best method of transportation is via a specialty helicopter. The flight path will take the sculpture in two separate trips from Kilwell Fibretube on Te Ngae Road to Te Puia carpark next to the roundabout.

Once the sculpture reaches Te Puia carpark, a crane will lift the sculpture in its two separate pieces and lower them into the roundabout.

What you need to know:

- Installation is strictly weather dependent meaning the team won't know exactly when installation will occur until the morning of.
- There is a limited window of availability for the specialty helicopter. Saturday 12 September is the earliest date for installation.
- The helicopter flight plan avoids all residential areas
- Transportation to Te Puia carpark will take place early in the morning from 6.30am.
- During the crane operation, (6.30am 10.30am) stop/go traffic management will be in place at each arm of the Hemo roundabout. Motorists may experience delays of up to 10 minutes.
- The following temporary traffic management and closures will be in place on the day of the helicopter operation:
 - Pedestrian/bike entry to the paths under Hemo roundabout will be closed.

- Entry to Te Puia carpark (next to the roundabout) will be closed to pedestrians, bikes and vehicles
- O Stop/Go traffic management will be in place at Vaughan Road (behind Puketawhero Park), SH30/Te Ngae Road (east of Eastgate Business Park) and Tarawera Road (near intersection with Okareka Loop Road) where the helicopter will cross over public roads. Motorists may experience delays of up to 5 minutes at these locations.

Following installation the team from Kilwell Fibretube will be finishing parts of the construction that can only be done once it is in place within the roundabout. This work is weather dependent but is expected to take about two weeks and the roundabout (and the shared paths underneath) will be open during this time.

Objective

This installation plan is outlines the process of lifting the Hemo Gorge Roundabout Sculpture from the production facility at Kilwell Fibretube, located at 490 Te Ngae Road to the middle of the roundabout on SH30 outside Te Puia for installation.

The following must be read and understood by all team members.

Project Overview, Hemo Gorge Sculpture

The sculptures is comprised of two pieces – the inner and outer helixes. Installation methodology has two key stages:

- 1. Helicopter the sculptures (outer and inner helixes) to Te Puia Car Park
- 2. Crane sculptures from car park into Hemo Roundabout.

Each helix will be flown to the Te Puia Car Park, and craned into place, separately.

Proposed installation date/s

Saturday 12th or Sunday 13th September.

It is expected the installation will take between 2 and 4 hours. Approximate timeframe for installation is 6am – 10:30am.

We need it calm or a slight breeze from the west so as to be able to fly in from the east. Preferred time for the lift is early morning to take advantage of low wind and traffic volumes. Wind speed gusting over 20 knots or any wind from the East will mean a No GO. We will make a decision 3 – 4 days before if it looks possible to make the installation, and then a final confirmation the night before. This decision will be made by the pilot in conjunction with the Install Lead.

Programme

- Have a landing platform set up at Te Puia car park with anchor blocks to secure the helixes to
- Have eastern (forest) side of roundabout closed off, with stop/go running traffic through the western side of roundabout
- Have crane parked on road on eastern side of roundabout
- Fly outer helix onto car park landing platform and secure to anchor blocks
- As helicopter flies back to Kilwell, crane picks up outer helix and moves to inside of roundabout (still attached to crane)
- Helicopter lands inner helix at carpark and it's secured to anchor blocks
- Install outer helix and then inner helix by crane.

Installation Teams

The following project plan shows the approximate estimated timings and responsibilities of each team in the installation. Teams are as follows:

- ML Mark Law (Pilot) & Chopper.

 Role is to lift helixes and place into Te Puia Car Park.
- K1 Kilwell Team No.1 onsite at Kilwell, 490 Te Ngae Road.
 Role is to attach lifting harness and flight sail to helixes and then longline to lifting harness.
- KH1 Kahu Helicopters ground Crew team at Kilwell
 Role is to attach lifting harness and flight sail to helixes and then longline to lifting harness.
- KH2 Kahu Helicopters ground Crew team in Te Puia carpark.
 Role is to guide pilot from landing site, receive loads, and secure helixes before detaching from longline.
- K2 Kilwell team No.2 in Te Puia carpark.

 Role is to manage installation of helixes by crane and bolting of baseplate to sculpture plinth once installed in roundabout.
- IMP Impell specialist ground team to assist with installation at roundabout
- PC Pollock Cranes (operator and Dogman)
 Role is to crane helixes from Te Puia Car Park and place on sculpture plinth in roundabout.
 Includes connecting crane line to helix lifting harnesses.
- WB Will Bamford RLC lead. Role is to be in charge of the project overview, including having total authority to make decisions on the day of the lift. Contractually, this is Kilwell's responsibility. The installation will still be Kilwell's responsibility, with Will there to make any required judgment calls on the day (with team consultation or solo, as required). He is also be in charge of the overview between all parties (Traffic Management, Event Management, Communications, Groundcrew, Pilot, Crane Operator, Dogman). He will be based at Hemo Roundabout.

- 4. It is expected Crane installation will take between 1 and 3 hours.




There will be an area set aside (min 25m by 25m) at Te Puia car park to drop the helixes and tie them down. The helixes will be secured by guidelines to deadman anchors (either containers or concrete blocks). This area can also be used for the Helicopter to land if experiencing issues.

The crane will be located on Hemo Road. The distance between the Crane and both the work area in Te Puia Car Park and the sculpture plinth is approximately 25m. The crane has a working reach of 30m.

Installation Trouble Shooting

- The outer helix will have guidelines on it to guide it to place.
- There is plywood on inside of first helix to guide second one (as it sits inside the outer helix). This one won't have guidelines.
- The bolts the baseplates are dropping on are M16 and the holes in the platform are 25mm. The outer platform is sitting on 48 M16 bolts. The inner helix 24
- We will have 2 4 130mm 150mm bolt sleeves per helix to assist with lining baseplate and bolts up
- The bolts and the baseplate have been run over with a template 3+ times
- The crane allows us to hold the baseplates over the bolts and get alignment before lowering the helixes into place.
- If the bolts are out of alignment or get damaged, PC will lift up and we will have sledge hammers to straighten the bolt back up. If damaged, Laszlo is comfortable rethreading the bolts once helix is in place (or grouting bolt in place)
- We will have angle grinders for worse case scenario of having to get rid of a bolt
- The area in the Te Puia car park will be set up to store the sculptures if we cannot get them installed on the plinth on the day.



Thank you very much for everyone's hard work today. While it had its challenges, today was great and I am really proud of what we achieved. We got both helices on the roundabout plinth!

Installation of the outer helix and helicopter delivery of the inner helix was text book and went as planned. When craning in the inner helix (around 7:40am), we ran into a fitment issue. The inner helix is slightly wider than the inside width of the outer helix as it comes down the helix, so we could not get it to the bolts on the required alignment. Everyone kicked into gear and we went through a four hour problem solving process to try and get the inner helix through the pinch point. This involved four steps:

- 1. Removing the inner helix, placing strops around it to then squeeze it together;
- 2. Cutting a gap into a support links between helix strands;
- 3. Putting double cuts on the main tubes;
- 4. Removing the chevrons.

Each of these steps took around an hour each. They provided progress but it was small and ultimately, at 12pm, we made the decision to call a halt to the final part of the installation. The inner helix is sitting inside the outer helix on blocks 200mm above the plinth (100mm above the bolts). It is orientated about 10degrees from where it needs to be to meet the bolts.

I want to acknowledge that, to ensure we did not have too much of an adverse impact on traffic movements through the roundabout, I had made a commitment to be completed by 10:30am. I made the call to push through until the road was reopened around 12:30pm. While this was still within our TMP approval of 1pm, I want to acknowledge and apologise for the traffic interruptions and breaking my commitment to NZTA. I believe we made the right call to continue through the problem solving process, as taking these four steps in a sequential action was both logical and minimised damage to the structure. It was also cost efficient, with the cost of resetting the crane, traffic/event management etc, being in excess of \$10k per day. Pausing once these options were extinguished was the next required step to ensure we can spend time thinking about how to complete the final piece. As we sit, the methodology to complete the installation process does not require any further road closures or hireage of cranes/helicopters.

Kilwell and James (Engineer – Gurit) are meeting Sunday 13th to determine which further sections of the inner/outer helices need to (and can) be removed to provide enough space for the inner helix to land on the bolts in the correct alignment. The inner helix will then be jacked up and placed on swivel blocks. This will allow the helix to be moved on the plinth and lined up with the required bolts. The helix will then be jacked down onto the bolts. Removed sections of the sculpture will be repaired. This will happen from Monday. Between now and 9am Monday, VR security are providing 24 hour security of Te Ahi Tupua.

If for some reason the Engineers determine we cannot temporarily thin out the helixes, there are other options to look at such as having the inner helix located 250mm higher on sections of steel beams (which would allow for required alignment but be slightly higher).

Kilwell is leading the process from here, and we will assist as needed.

Thanks again for everyone's commitment and hard work to make today a reality. Attached are some neat photos from Stephen.

Rotorua story brought to life by Rotorua business

Te Ahi Tupua, the sculpture built to stand at the southern gateway of Rotorua, has been successfully transported to Hemo Gorge roundabout.

Today marks the last steps of a significant journey for project partners Rotorua Lakes Council, Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency, New Zealand Māori Arts and Crafts Institute | Te Puia and Kilwell Fibretube.

The installation process began at dawn, with a karakia to grant safe passage to Te Ahi Tupua as it travelled to Hemo Gorge as well as to clear the area around Kilwell Fibretube so that new mahi can take place.

The transportation from Kilwell Fibretube, using a Black Hawk helicopter from Kāhu NZ, made for an interesting display over the city as it flew over the edges of Lake Rotorua and Whakarewarewa Forest in the early hours of the

morning. Both the inner and outer helix were safely and smoothly delivered to the roundabout by Kāhu NZ pilot Mark Law.

A crane was then used to lift each helix and lower it into place within the roundabout. The outer slotted into place easily within a few minutes. The inner helix took more time and careful manoeuvring to position the structure within the outer helix ready for the final works to take place.

Now that the sculpture is in place at Hemo roundabout, the team from Kilwell Fibretube will complete the final work to bolt the inner helix and connect the two helices. The connections between the outer and the inner helix will go through the same lamination process as the rest of the sculpture - work that is expected to take about two weeks, weather permitting

Rotorua Lakes Council's Operations Group Manager Jocelyn Mikaere says today's operation means the project nearing completion with some minor works to be finished.

"We are pleased today's operation went as smoothly as it did. Creating and installing this remarkable taonga is something that our teams and our partners have worked really hard on.

"There has been a lot of anticipation to see Te Ahi Tupua welcoming locals and visitors as they travel into Rotorua. The concept behind the design speaks to a significant Te Arawa narrative and represents the arrival of geothermal energy to our district. The innovation in the way it was constructed also provides a perfect example of the talented people we have in Rotorua."

The original artist, Stacy Gordine from the New Zealand Māori Arts and Crafts Institute (NZMACI) will also install the final figurative elements during this time.

Kilwell Fibretube Chief Executive Craig Wilson says for his team, it is extremely satisfying to see Te Ahi Tupua in place.

"Kilwell has been a locally-owned company in Rotorua for more than 85 years. Many of our products go off-shore so for us, bringing to life the remarkable piece of art created by Stacy Gordine and the team at NZMACI and showcasing the innovation of our business was really important.

"This sculpture was designed locally by NZMACI and has also been manufactured locally. The majority of it is handmade by our employees. We have a talented team and for most of the project, they were coming up with solutions to things that had never been done before. We are incredibly proud that we had a crew that persevered through the challenges to bring to life something pretty spectacular that can be enjoyed by the whole community."

The work towards enhancing the southern gateway to Rotorua began in 2015 prior to the upgrades to the intersection of State Highway 5 and State Highway 30. Rotorua Lakes Council and Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency agreed to enter into a partnership to commission a large-scale artwork to become the centrepiece of the new roundabout.

Te Ahi Tupua tells the story of the arrival of geothermal energy to the Rotorua region. The design concept was developed by NZMACI and was the successful submission in 2015 when Council and Waka Kotahi called for artists to design the roundabout's centrepiece.

NZMACI General Manager, Eraia Kiel says the opportunity to play an instrumental role in a major Rotorua artwork, located in its own rohe, drew NZMACI to support the project, with all of its contribution provided in kind.

"Te Ahi Tupua is a truly ground-breaking piece of work, involving huge degrees of creativity from the outset - and an extremely technical process in the following stages in order to bring it to life. It challenged the boundaries of what could be done, which is what makes it particularly special.

"It's important we continue to tell Te Arawa stories in new and innovative ways. While Te Ahi Tupua describes the origins of geothermal activity in Rotorua through the story of Te Arawa tohunga Ngātoro-i-rangi, it also tells other stories of our community – referencing concepts such as the interconnectedness of people, the pursuit of knowledge and the importance of looking after our natural environment."

Once the remaining construction work is complete and final design pieces are in place, the project partners will look to officially mark the installation of Te Ahi Tupua.

Response from Operations Group Manager Jocelyn Mikaere -

We are pleased with Saturday's operation to get Te Ahi Tupua to Hemo gorge. The helicopter transport was text book and both helices are in place in the centre of the roundabout. Kilwell now has some prescheduled work to do on site to connect the inner to the outer helix.

The outer helix was secured in place within minutes. However the inner helix, took more manoeuvring than expected to get it into place as the tolerances were very tight between the helices. To restore traffic flow on the day, the inner was temporarily fixed in place within the outer helix and secured to allow the installation team more time to adjust it.

Kilwell and Gurit, the composite engineers have finished the installation of the inner on to the base plinth but this required the temporary removal of several small sections of the inner tube. These tubes and the additional post installation inner to outer tubes will be installed over the next few weeks.

For your information (not to be used as quotes):

The size and shape is the same as the original construction plans. The picture that is commonly related to Te Ahi Tupua was an artist impression from 2015 and during the journey to complete Te Ahi Tupua, Council

has shared more realistic photos of the sculpture. A 3D printed mini version has also been shared with the community since Kilwell Fibretube took over the project. You can view that <u>here</u>

Glenys Searancke, Rotorua Residents and Ratepayers chairwoman:

"[The sculpture] is disappointing. It is isn't that visible, it blends into the background.

"It's not as imposing as we thought it would be. It's a good thing and a bad thing. It means people aren't gawking at it as they go around the roundabout, but it's far less impressive.

She said the time it had taken between the transferral of the sculpture from Kilwell's warehouse to finishing and officially opening the sculpture was "appalling"

"The council should be concentrating on one project at a time. They've got all these balls in the air.

"It must be going to cost more."

Unfortunately, one question in the LGOIMA has fallen off that list - "Can the council please also provide the updated figure of what the council has spent on the sculpture to date?"

That's the updated, overall figure, not just the cost of the installation.

Could you please also clarify if the sculpture has been *further* altered/damaged in the course of installation? We already had it confirmed that there was "temporary removal of several small sections of the inner tube" from shortly after the sculpture was transferred (which you may be aware we reported) but has anything further happened to it since installation began?

If the council does not have a date set for opening, is there a rough timeframe the council, Kilwell and Gurit are working toward?

Can you please get back to me by midday tomorrow with these?
